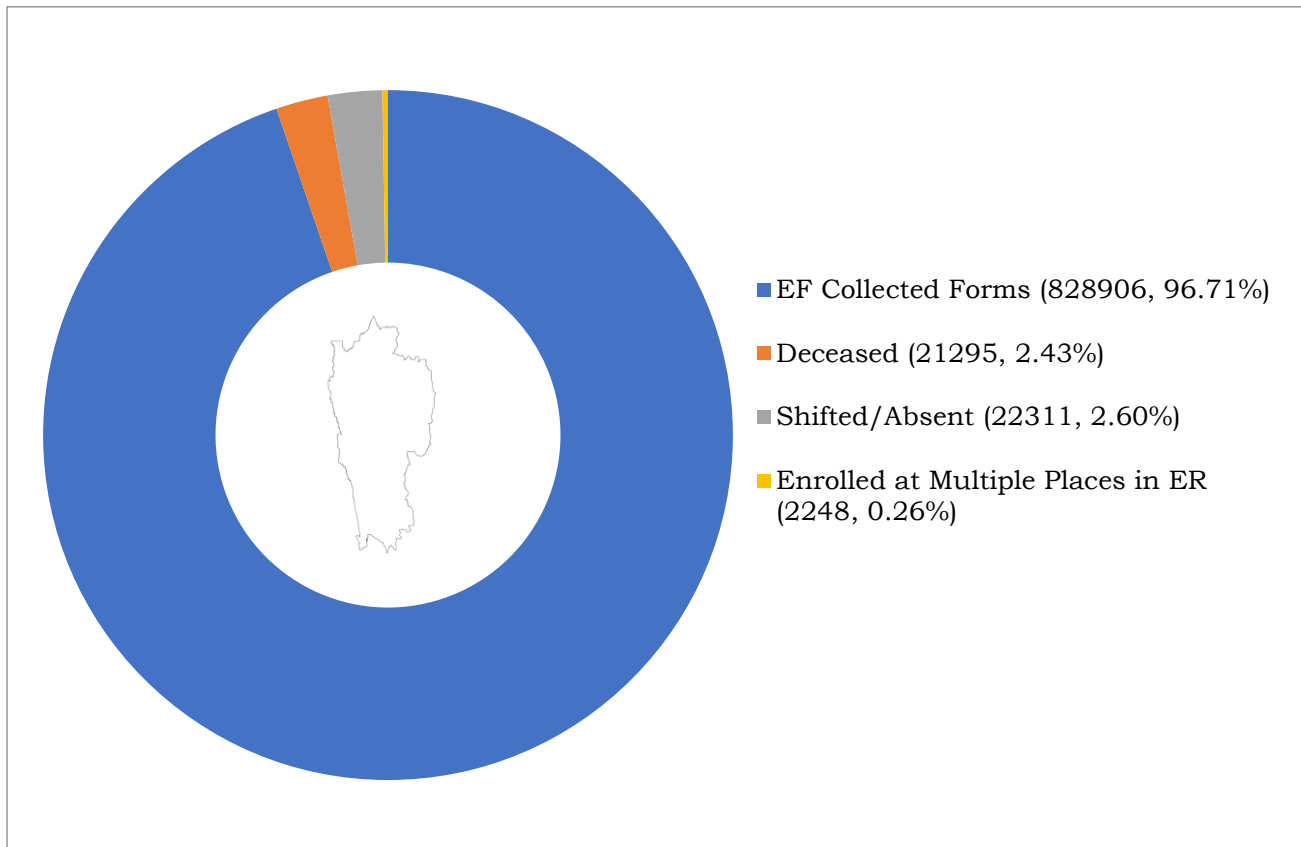

**PRESS NOTE**

**MIZORAM SIR: Key Findings of Enumeration Phase  
30.05.2026 – 28.06.2026**



\* BLO did not find these electors or did not get back their Enumeration Forms because they:

- Became electors in other States/UTs, or
- Were not found in existence, or
- Did not submit the form till 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2026 or
- Were not willing to register as an elector for some reason or other

Genuine electors can still be added back in electoral rolls during the Claims and Objection period from 04.07.2026 to 04.08.2026.

\*\* The name of the Electors found enrolled at multiple places in Electoral Rolls will be retained only at one place.

The Election Commission of India (ECI) is implementing the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the Electoral Rolls in **Mizoram** with a clearly defined objective to ensure inclusion of all the eligible electors and exclusion of all the ineligible electors with full transparency at every stage of the process. The key aims and measures undertaken under SIR are outlined below:

**1. Participation of All Electors and All Political Parties:**

Out of 8,75,068 electors as on 30.05.2026, over 8,28,906 electors have submitted their Enumeration Forms as on 25.06.2026 reflecting an overwhelming participation in the third phase of SIR.

The successful completion of this phase is the result of coordinated efforts of DEOs of all 11 districts, 40 EROs, 49 AEROs, and BLO Supervisors, BLOs and Assistant BLOs deployed at 1301 polling booths, supported by volunteers. Field representatives of all 6 recognised political parties, including their District Presidents, also actively participated, with as many as 3,937 Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by them.

**2. Ensuring No Eligible Elector is Left Behind:**

- i. To ensure universal awareness and participation, during the enumeration period, CEOs, DEOs and EROs conducted extensive awareness campaigns and held meetings with political parties to explain the process and share progress updates.
- ii. BLOs also conducted booth-level meetings with BLAs, who were permitted to file up to 50 Enumeration Forms per day to ensure their active involvement. BLOs carried out house-to-house visits to all electors whose names were in the electoral rolls as on 30.05.2026 to distribute Enumeration Forms, followed by at least three visits for collection. BLAs and volunteers also made dedicated efforts to ensure that no eligible elector was missed.

**3. Schedule of Special Intensive Revision (SIR) after publication of Draft Electoral Rolls w.r.t. qualifying date as on 01.07.2026:**

#### **4. Draft Electoral Roll will be available in the following:**

- i. In the Office of Chief Electoral Officer, Mizoram, District Election Officers and Electoral Registration Officers.
- ii. Chief Electoral Officer, Mizoram's website (<https://ceo.mizoram.gov.in/>)
- iii. From the draft voter list available with local Booth Level Officer (BLO).
- iv. From the ECINET mobile app.
- v. From voters.eci.gov.in.

If any elector does not find his/her name in the Draft Electoral Roll, application for inclusion of name shall be required to be submitted in Form 6 along with Declaration Form and other required documents.

#### **5. Application Forms:**

For any application for inclusion, correction or deletion, applicants must submit the following forms through the Booth Level Officer. Application form can also be submitted online through ECINET mobile App or through <https://voters.eci.gov.in/>

#### **6. Special Initiatives Taken:**

- i. Regular Review Meetings with District Election Officers and Electoral Registration Officers were conducted by the Chief Electoral Officer, Mizoram to ensure the smooth implementation of the exercise. Regular review meetings of low-performing Assembly Constituencies were also held to discuss the challenges they encountered and formulate strategies for improvement.
- ii. Online Google Visit Sheet of District Election Officers, Electoral Registration Officers, Assistant Electoral Registration Officers was prepared for regular monitoring of all district election machineries to ensure that implementation on the ground is effectively monitored.
- iii. Help Desks were set up in District Election Offices as well as in the Offices of Electoral Registration Officers to facilitate the Booth Level Officers and electors. Special Camps were also organized in various

locations spearheaded by the EROs/AEROs in areas which required special attention.

- iv. Electoral Registration Officers regularly visited the Booth Level Officers, handholding them in the entire digitization process.
- v. Volunteers were deployed across the State to assist the electors in filling up the enumeration forms. Non-Governmental Organizations like Young Mizo Association actively participated in the enumeration phase in identification as well as sensitization of electors.
- vi. In various flood prone areas, Booth Level Officers and other Election Officials were equipped with life-saving jackets and equipment during the enumeration phase to ensure safety of officials while at the same time ensuring that no eligible electors are left out in the enumeration phase.
- vii. The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Mizoram engaged popular Social Media Influencers during the Enumeration Phase to encourage and facilitate electors to fill up the enumeration forms.
- viii. To ensure maximum outreach, District Media Nodal Officers are appointed in each district to disseminate information about the entire exercise. Information in the form of promotional videos, testimonials, e-flyers was disseminated on various Social Media Platforms to generate maximum awareness.
- ix. Hoardings/ Banners about Special Intensive Revision were put up in various prominent places across the State.

## **7. Inclusion of Young Electors:**

- i. Young electors who have attained or will attain 18 years of age on or before 01.07.2026 are being encouraged to apply through Form-6 along with the prescribed declaration form.
- ii. Special camps will be conducted across the State to enroll all eligible young voters.

## **8. Engagement with Electors and Political Parties:**

In every Polling Station, the Booth Level Officer furnished the list of Absent/Shifted/Duplicate/Death whose Enumeration Forms could not be received to the Booth Level Agents, who scrutinized the list carefully. The Minutes of Meeting along with the ASDD List have been uploaded by the BLOs in the BLO App.

## **9. Assistance by Election Staff and Volunteers:**

The entire election machinery, supported by volunteers, is assisting electors, particularly senior citizens, PwD electors and vulnerable groups. Volunteers are facilitating coordination with government departments to minimise the burden on electors

## **10. Redressal of Issues During Enumeration:**

DEOs of all 11 districts have personally addressed every issue reported through print, TV or social media to ensure that no grievance remains unattended.

## **11. Scrutiny of Draft Electoral Roll:**

- i. As per the SIR Order, the Draft Electoral Roll has been published on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2026. Printed and digital booth-wise copies have been provided to all recognised political parties and made available on the CEO's website (<https://ceo.mizoram.gov.in/>).
- ii. During the claims and objections period from 4<sup>th</sup> July 2026 to 4<sup>th</sup> August 2026, any existing or prospective elector may file claims or objections for inclusion of eligible electors or deletion of ineligible names. A total of 40 EROs and 49 AEROs are in position to scrutinise such cases by 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2026. If required, more number of Additional AEROs will be notified from time to time to dispose off the claims and objections, within the prescribed time limit.

## **12. No Deletion Without Due Process:**

- i. As per Para 5(b) of SIR guidelines, no name can be deleted from the draft roll published on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2026 without notice and a speaking order by the ERO/AERO. Any aggrieved elector may appeal to the District Magistrate and thereafter to the Chief Electoral Officer under Section 24 of the RP Act, 1950.
- ii. The Commission reiterates its firm commitment to a transparent, participative and inclusive revision process, ensuring that no eligible elector is left out and no ineligible name remains in the Electoral Rolls.
